California Perinatal Transport System

The California Perinatal Transport System was established in 1976 pursuant to the enactment of California Assembly Bill 4439. This act appropriated funds for the development of a dispatch service to address the need for facilitating transports of critically ill infants and mothers with high risk conditions to regional Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) and Perinatal High Risk Units (PHRUs).

The CPTS provides the collection and analysis of perinatal and neonatal transport data for regional planning, outreach program development, and outcome analysis. This information is reported back to the participating hospitals, and the Division of Maternal and Child Health of the California Department of Health. We support an integrated network of regional perinatal programs in California. Opportunities for regional perinatal programs to share and solve their common problems are provided through meetings of its Advisory Committee.

The California Perinatal Transport System can assist health care professionals in the REFERRAL of high-risk pregnant women and newborn infants. An updated bed availability status is obtained daily from regional CCS approved neonatal intensive care units. There are many NICUs participating in this daily survey that includes an array of County, for-profit, non-profit, University affiliated, and HMO owned facilities. This information is being made available via this website.

Northern California Perinatal Transport System

The Northern and Southern California Perinatal Transport Systems were established by mandate of the State Legislature in 1976. The Northern California Perinatal Transport System is based at the Lucile Salter Packard Childrens Hospital at Stanford.

The NCPTS:

- Provides emergency access to the perinatal system for high-risk maternity patients and critically ill neonates.
- Assists in the referral and transport of high-risk maternity patients and critically ill neonates to appropriate CCS approved perinatal and neonatal care facilities.
- Maintains a bed-availability roster for neonatal intensive care facilities. Direct assistance for consultation/referral may be obtained by calling the NCPTS Dispatch Center, 650-723-7342. With the initiation of this web project, that information is now available on the internet

The Southern California Perinatal Transport System (SCPTS), formerly known as the Infant Medical Dispatch Center, was established in 1976 pursuant to the enactment of California Assembly Bill 4439. This act appropriated funds for the development of a dispatch service to address the need for facilitating transports of critically ill infants and mothers with high risk conditions to regional Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) and Perinatal High Risk Units (PHRUs).


Specific Legislative Mandate

- Establish a 24-hour-a-day, year-round dispatch center linking all hospitals providing obstetrical services with neonatal intensive care nurseries.
- Provide service for the region south of the Tehachapi Mountains (Southern California) encompassing the following 11 counties: Imperial, Inyo, Kern, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, and Ventura.

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

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Regional Perinatal Programs of California

Perinatal Regionalization in California

The Regional Perinatal Programs of California (RPPC) evolved from the need for comprehensive, cooperative networks of public and private health care providers within geographic areas to promote the well-being of pregnant women and their babies. In the early 1980s the California Legislature mandated the development of a statewide network of perinatal regionalization. The goal was to match the needs of high risk perinatal patients with the appropriate type of care by developing a multi-tiered network of care providers and facilities within specific geographic areas.


RPPC Today

There are now 14 Title V funded RPPCs providing services to all areas of the State. The programs are designed to assist the California State Department of Health Services, Maternal and Child Health Branch (MCH) to ensure that pregnant women and newborns have access to appropriate levels of high quality care, to provide for safe and effective treatment of women and their babies before, during and after delivery, to meet the needs of the infants at risk for neonatal complications and to reduce the incidence of maternal death due to obstetric complications.


The regional programs serve as facilitators in coordinating and supporting perinatal quality improvement within their regions. RPPC staff obtain and disseminate

4. Implements State Program Unit activities: data/evaluation, community awareness, education and outreach
